6. **A Brief note about the University.**

Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar University is a Central University, established on 10th January 1996. The 250 acres' University campus named 'Vidya Vihar' is located at the Raebareli Road, about 10 Km. South of Charbagh, the main Railway Station of Lucknow. It is a residential University, in which staff and faculty members are accommodated. The University is committed to develop as a centre of excellence in the field of higher education.

The uniqueness of University is evident from its basic philosophy, policies and programmes, which are spelt out and enshrined in the University Act and Statutes. The Objectives of the University are:

- To promote advanced knowledge by providing instructional and research facilities for integrated courses in Science and key frontier areas of Technology and other allied disciplines;
- To offer appropriate courses relevant for the development of socially and educationally depressed section of the people, including agricultural technology and rural crafts;
- To promote the study of the principles for which Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar worked during his lifetime, namely, national integration, social justice and democratic way of life, and also study of the constitutions of the world;
- To take appropriate measures for promoting innovations in teaching-learning processes in inter-disciplinary studies and research; and
- To pay special attention to the promotion of educational and economic interests and welfare of the people in general and of members belonging to the SC/ST in particular.

8. **Brief details of the support services in the University on the following.**

CENTRAL LIBRARY

The foundation for the library services of Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar University, Lucknow was laid in January 1998. Keeping with the vision and mission of the University, the library has been established "to promote knowledge and application through its effective dissemination of knowledge and information". The library acts as a learning resource centre of the University to supplement educational and information needs of the faculty and students. It also provides information services and facilities to meet the requirements of teaching, training and research programmes. The library services are also open to University staff and visitors.

UNIVERSITY COMPUTER CENTRE

The BBAU University has a Computer Centre to assist in the growth and development of teaching, research and other activities such as administration, finance, examination and admission of the University. This is a centre for catering the computer related requirements of the students, staff and faculties of the university. The Centre has high speed internet connectivity via National Knowledge Network, Govt. of India It is the hub for Internet connectivity which is available in university campus. At present, 65 numbers of dual core based PCs and a server are connected with LAN environment. The Computer Centre provides computational facilities to the University community with the help of more than 2000 networks access points. The Computer Centre is managing 7 servers which are being used by the Finance section, Academic section, Exam section, Computer Centre, NKN, Network and web interactive teaching in all departments of the University. It also provides various advanced and special purpose software. Besides creating an IT umbrella over the campus this exclusively engaged in procurement of computers and other peripherals as per demand of University. It carried out various training programs and recruitment exams. The centre is utilising its manpower well to accomplish its job.

SPORTS FACILITIES

A famous quote ‘healthy man can think healthy’ and sports are the best mechanism to be healthy. The University, being sensitive for overall development of students, realizes that a balance in physical, mental and emotional growth is essential for a comprehensive personality. The National Sports Policy (1984) and the New Education Policy (1986) also emphasize on the need for introduction of sports in the academic programme. Keeping this view in the background, the University has a dedicated sports team headed by Dr. Manish Kumar Verma as coordinator. At present, the University has a multipurpose sports ground in the campus having facilities like Lawn Tennis, Volleyball, Badminton, and athletics etc. In addition, we have indoor Gymnasium equipped with all modern facilities for physical training. Within Indoor games, Badminton, Table-Tennis, Chess, and Carom facilities are available. The university is in the process to construct sport grounds for Football, Hockey, and Cricket, etc. lawn Tennis Court is also under construction in the campus.

To enhance healthy competitive propensity among the students, the sports section organizes inter-school competition time to time in which all the team members of winner and runner-up teams are provided gold and silver medals respectively along with a certificate. The university is sure that these facilities would instill students a sense of confidence beside physical fitness. It would help them in becoming a complete man so that they can withstand the challenges of life.

HOSTELS

VISHAKHA BOYS HOSTEL ‘A’

Objective

The hostel is committed to develop think thinking of global citizenship amongst the residents. Through its various endeavours it encourages students to think beyond local, regional and divisive lines. Besides the hostel administration is also determined and dedicated for providing healthy living to the residents.

Facilities

The university Boys Hostel one four storied building having spacious room with balcony, catering the needs of students on double occupancy basis. The accommodation is being provided by the Dean Student Welfare office on the University entrance merit basis and the residence place of the student.

The hostel has a dining hall with a sitting capacity of sixty students. The mess has been privatized. Joining the mess is optional in the hostel. The mess provides good and healthy food to the students in order to maintain the culture of the university the mess menu is changed every month keeping in view of the requirements of different students from diverse backgrounds.

The hostel has television hall, indoor recreation hall with table tennis, volley ball, badminton, and one reading hall. The daily news paper such as Dainik Jagran, Times of India, Amar Uzala, Rozana Rastriya Sahara Urdu, The Hindu, The Economic Times, Employment News as well as magazine India Today. The hostel has twenty four hours guard facility. The residents are expected to observe the “General rules and regulation”, which is provided to the students at the times of admission.

VISHAKHA BOYS HOSTEL ‘B’

Besides the hostel administration is also determined and dedicated for providing healthy living to the residents.

Facilities

SANGAMITRA GIRLS HOSTEL

Hostels in academic institutions are the epicentre of the dynamics of the campus life. Sanghmitra Girl’s Hostel spread over vast area and surrounded by green cover, encompassing gardens has been providing fuel and force to the life and motion of University’s liberal democratic academic culture. Situated next to the Vice Chancellor’s Residence, the Hostel is a four storied building having 84 rooms with balcony and good ventilation. It is a spacious, well furnished hostel enclosing lawns with rose beds and hedges. The Hostel provides residential facilities to bonafide postgraduate and Ph. D female students of the University. Mess facility is available in the hostel. Mess is privatized but run under the supervision of hostel administration. Nutritious and hygienic meals are provided to the inmates. Four Commercial Aqua Guards cum Purifiers are installed on each floor to provide purified RO water to the inmates. Four hobby Rooms of the hostel provide the residents recreational facilities such as Table-tennis, Carom-board, Chess-board, and a separate TV room apart from the newspapers and magazines to keep them on the *qui vive*.

The guiding principle the University has been to uphold democratic and egalitarian values and strive towards intellectual excellence. Therefore, the main objective of Sanghmitra Girl’s Hostel is to ensure that the inmates are able to devote adequate time to their studies and research as well as to develop a climate congenial to co-curricular and extra-curricular activities of inmates. All hostel inmates are expected to maintain the spirit of camaraderie and dignity. The Hostel Office located within the Hostel premises, is integral part of the Hostel. There are several employees to look after the daily chores in the hostel. The health services are made available to the residents by the University Health Centre located inside the University Campus.

- A mehendi competition was organized on 'Nirbhaya Night' to promote the extra-curricular talent of the hostel inmates.
- A poster competition was organized on the topic 'Contemporary Women's Issues' on 'Nirbhaya Night'. A number of posters had been displayed which portrayed various types of women's issues e.g. eco-feminism, domestic violence, molestation, dowry deaths etc.

GUEST HOUSE

The University has a well equipped guest house which centrally located in the University campus. It has enough rooms to serve university guests. The Guest House have a VIP suit as well to facilitate the VIP who comes from India and outside from India. All rooms are well furnished with all required facilities. Guest House has its own dining and meals that served to guests as per the menu on their specific demand.

CANTEEN

The University has a Canteen for students as well other staff to cater their need for food near administrative building. It opens from 9:30 to 6:00pm on all working days. The rates for the food are normal and the quality of food is also being observed. There are proper sitting facilities even they can arrange the food on demand as and when required in packing. A Parag Dairy booth has opened in the University campus to cater the need of milk in the campus. The University is also looking for a branded cafeteria in the campus.

9. **A brief note about progress made by the University during XI Plan.**

Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar University (BBAU) is a premier central university established by the Government of India, Ministry of Human Resources Development with the high ideals of promoting advanced knowledge by providing higher standards of instructional and research facilities. True to its mission, the University has been playing a pivotal role in fostering knowledge enhancement, promoting high-end research and setting standards infrastructure development. It was named as 'Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar University' and foundation stone was laid by Shri Rajiv Gandhi Ji on April 14, 1989. Initially conceptualized as a B R Ambedkar University (Project) by the Uttar Pradesh Government in the year 1989, it was subsequently notified as a Central University on 10th January 1996. Spread over a sprawling campus of 251 acres, the University has a mandate of providing 50% reservation for SC/ST students in admissions to all the courses.

In the last five years, the University has transformed itself into a unique academic centre of excellence with many convergence of research, innovation, equity and a wide array of

futuristic and time-honoured curricula. Realizing that basic infrastructural facilities are vital for knowledge empowerment, the University has taken steps to augment the developmental works. The fact that the University encompassed only 5 Schools and 10 Departments in the year 2007, as regards to the existing 8 Schools and 23 Departments today speaks volumes on the enormous face lift and has been a incredible learning experience. This has augured well for the students and academic fraternity to take up scholastic and intellectual pursuits in a serene and enriched environment within the campus.

In terms of infrastructural development there were only Administrative block complex; School building of Ambedkar Studies (Phase I); Rearing house for department of Applied Animal Science; Boys hostel of 200 capacity; Guest House (Non-functional); Building for VC's Residence-cum-camp office (non-occupied); One 11/0.4 K.V. sub-station with 1250 KVA Capacity transformer; Facility of Bank (Extn. Counter); Post Office; Deep tube well till 2007.

However, there has been significant development of infrastructural facilities, created during the last five years such as; School building of Ambedkar Studies (Phase II); University Guest House made functional; Building for VC's Residence-cum-camp office occupied; School building for Environmental Sciences; Computer Centre with 60 Terminals; University Science Instrumentation Centre (USIC); Girls Hostel of 200 capacity; Virtual Class Room; Staff Residential Quarters: A Type (12 Nos.), B Type(32Nos), C Type (32 Nos.); one more Electrical sub-station 11/0.4 K.V. with 1250 KVA Capacity transformer; Sports facilities created (Gym, Badminton Court, Lawn Tennis Court etc.); Main arterial road in the campus along with other small Link roads. Further, 2 boys' Hostels, Two Hostels sanctioned by Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment for construction of exclusive for SC Boys and Girls, Phase-1 of Central Library, Auditorium, Road related works, Phase 1 of SBBT Building, SLS Building, campus development, Created three Conference Halls and made functional, Health Centre, Parking Sheds have been constructed, ATM facility within campus, Basic Facility for Women and RCA building are on the verge of completion and would be made functional by the end of this year.

Various new Schools proposed viz., School for Language and Literature, School for Performing Arts, School for Social Science & Humanities, School for Agricultural Sciences, School for Language and Literature, School for Commerce, School for Performing Arts and School for Space Science & Technology. The university has also proposed new Multi-disciplinary Centers of study and chairs in the existing school for Ambedkar Studies including centre for Dalit Studies, centre for Gender Studies, and centre for the study of Backward Classes, Minorities and indigenous people. The proposed chairs are Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Chair and Shri Babu Jagjivan Ram Chair.

In addition to the above, BBAU has got Indian Environmental Radiation Monitoring Network (IERMON) System from Bhabha Atomic Research Centre, Mumbai for monitoring the radiation and creating awareness to the student community. This station will deliver the online environmental radiation levels around the nuclear power plants from our country. This will give alarm signal as well if any radioactive material passing from nearby area. Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment has sanctioned Rs. 04 crore for boys and girls hostel.

Member, National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), Govt. of India in principle agreed in the meeting to have a specialized radiation calibration training centre at BBAU for training of the police personnel and paramilitary forces if required. As the trained manpower is available in the university.

With sincere and dedicated efforts, the UGC/MHRD has sanctioned 44 non teaching positions (including 11 on outsource basis) for BBAU which was a long time demand from the university.

The BBAU has also proposed new Departments for 12th five year plan such as Education, Social work, Psychology, Genetics & Plant Breeding, Soil Science & Agricultural Chemistry, Medicinal & Aromatic Plants, Ecology and Forestry, Post Harvest Management/Technology, Environmental Impact Study, Business Studies, Banking, Accountancy and Finance, Commerce, Family Resource Management, Food and Nutrition, Textile and Clothing, Department of Hindi, Department of Asian Languages (Japanese, Korean, Russian, Chinese and Arabic), Department of English, Department of Music, Department of Dance, Electronics & Communication and Department of Space Science.

To undertake and complete successfully the university is mobilizing additional grants from various agencies. These remarkable and significant infrastructural facilities have been created. The University has been able to carve a niche for itself within a short time of

inception. The developmental works and academic initiatives taken by the University has been undertaken after due approval from competent authorities governing the university in a most transparent manner as possible. Established norms, regulations with regard to UGC and Government of India Guidelines have been adhered to in principle.
